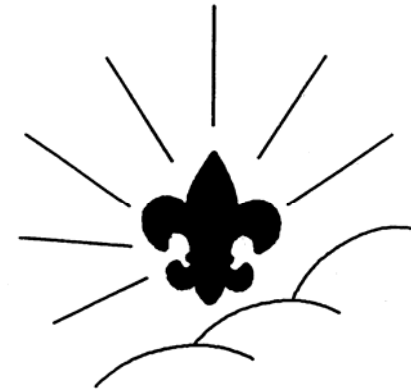


## Prayer

Take a nap every afternoon.

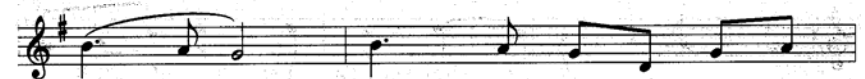
When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands and stick together.
